I acknowledge the lands of the Jagera and Turrbal people and pay my respects to Elders past and present and celebrate all Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander storytellers who have been creating on these lands for millennia, bringing their culture forward for generations to come.

It's been 24 years since La Boite presented *Closer*, and in a play that has been touted to be one of the best and most intricate representations of the politics of sex, it feels right to re-examine this work with a contemporary lens. I wanted to put this work in conversation with current socioeconomic, cultural and political circumstances.

Specifically, the team and I were fascinated by the role of Alice, and we were set on challenging our preconceived notions of who she is and the function she plays in the piece. Alice can be read as a typical 'stealvour-man' femme fatale. However, as we sat with the piece more and more, what began to emerge was a far more nuanced version of this 'girl from the country'. There are so many references in the text to honesty, truth, identity and morality. It seems at first that Alice does everything she can to conceal the truth - her name, her job, and everything about her seems fabricated. However, as we dig deeper, Alice seems to be the character who is the most honest.

Because Alice is so authentically herself, ultimately Larry, Dan and Anna are left scrambling to hold onto the lies about love, sex and relationships they have made for themselves. Larry is incapable of vulnerability, Dan uses other people's flaws to distract from his own, and Anna is set on contorting herself into everyone else's idea of who she should be.

Having worked almost exclusively on new Australian writing, making this version of Closer with this team has been an exhilarating experience and the team and I can't wait to share it with you all!

two Logies and the ADG Award for Best Actress. Her screen work includes Underbelly Razor, ANZAC Girls, House Husbands and most recently In our Blood and Darby and Joan, both for ABC. She is currently developing her debut novel Immaculate for screen with Hoodlum Productions, after it received The Australian/Vogel's Literary Award in 2023. (2019). He was in the Core Ensemble of the Queensland Shakespeare Ensemble between 2007 and 2019, performing with the company in over twenty productions. His other theatre credits include: Queensland Theatre - Black Diggers, The Odd Couple, An Octoroon, Twelfth Night, Nearer The Gods, Our Town, The Sunshine Club, and As You Like It; Ensemble Theatre -Black Cockatoo; Belloo Creative - Boy, Lost.



KEVIN SPINK (he/him)

Kevin is a Scottish Australian actor, writer and director, renowned for his dynamic presence on both stage and screen. He has honed his craft creating and touring work with theatre companies around the country and writing and directing short films.

Kevin has previously performed with La Boite in *An Ideal Husband, Away* and *Colder*. He has taken the stage with Queensland Theatre in *Drizzle Boy, First Casualty, Antigone, Hydra, Twelfth Night, St Mary's in Exile, Kelly, Gloria* and *Macbeth*. PATRICK MARBER

PLAYWRIGHT

Patrick Marber was born in London in 1964. He is an award-winning playwright, screenwriter and director. His work has won Evening Standard, Olivier, Time Out, New York and London Critics' Circle and Writers' Guild Awards and received BAFTA, British Comedy and Royal Television

Society Awards. His screenplays have been nominated for Golden Globe, BAFTA and Academy Awards. He received the British Independent Film Award for *Notes on a Scandal*. His second play, *Closer*, has been produced in more than 200 cities across the world.

Other plays include: Dealer's Choice, Howard Katz, The Red Lion, Three Days in the Country, The Musicians, The School Film, After Miss Julie, Don Juan in Soho. Stage adaptations include versions of Hedda Gabler, Exit The King and The Beaux' Stratagem (NT); and Trelawny of the 'Wells' (Donmar).

Screenplays include: Closer (Columbia Pictures); Notes on a Scandal (Fox Searchlight Pictures); Old Street (Film4/Box Films); Love You More (Film4). Patrick is the co-creator (with Peter Curran) of Bunk Bed (BBC Radio 4).

As a director his productions include Dealer's Choice (NT/Vaudeville), After Miss Julie (BBC), Closer (NT/Lyric/Music Box NY), '1953' (Almeida), Blue Remembered Hills (NT), The Old Neighborhood (Royal Court), The Caretaker (Comedy), Howard Katz (NT), Three Days in the Country (NT), Travesties (Menier/Apollo/Broadway), Don Juan in Soho (Wyndhams), Venus in Fur (Theatre Royal Haymarket), Exit The King (NT).

Most recently, he directed Tom Stoppard's *Leopoldstadt* at the Wyndhams Theatre, which won the Olivier Award for Best New Play in 2020. *Leopoldstadt* opened on Broadway in October 2022 and in June 2023 Patrick won the Tony Award for best Director of a Play and the Outer Critics Circle Award for outstanding Director of a Play.





COURTNEY STEWART (she/her)

DIRECTOR

Courtney Stewart is an acclaimed director, dramaturg, actor and teaching artist with a deep passion for intercultural works and multicultural dramaturgies.

She has worked on a number of productions and developments of new Australian work such

as Poison of Polygamy for La Boite and STC, Miss Peony for Belvoir Street Theatre, and The Hate Race for Malthouse Theatre. Other productions include Top Coat, Julius Caesar, Playing Beatie Bow and Hamlet – Prince of Skidmark and Australian Graffiti for STC; Double Delicious for Contemporary Asian Australian Performance; Neon Tiger by Julia-Rose Lewis and Single Asian Female by Michelle Law for La Boite and Belvoir Street Theatre; Barbaric Truth by Jordan Shea, and White Pearl by Anchuli Felicia King.

A proud Queenslander, Courtney started her professional career as an actor before honing her talents as an artistic leader, director and change maker for some of the country's most prolific companies and organisations including Sydney Theatre Company (Directing Associate and Richard Wherrett Fellow) and Contemporary Asian Australian Performance (Artistic Associate).

Courtney was previously Chair for the Equity Diversity Committee, a delegate to the National Performers Committee and a former board member for Contemporary Asian Australian Performance. She is the Artistic Director & CEO of La Boite Theatre and is a board member of Creative Australia.





M'OK MOKEAGUE (it/its/they/them) SET & COSTUME DESIGNER

M'ck McKeague is a performance maker, set and costume designer and scenographer currently living on unceded Yuggera and Turrbal land. Since completing the Master of Design for Performance at Victorian College of the Arts in 2018, M'ck has collaborated with Ivor MacAskill

& Rosana Cade (UK), Krishna Istha (UK), Michael Zavros, Rachel Hann & Nic Farr (UK), Company Bad (KOR/AUS), The Hole Collective, Lenine Bourke, All the Queens Men, Polyglot Theatre, Elbow Room, and Embittered Swish. M'ck advocates for trans and non-binary approaches to scenography and has presented on panels at Prague Quadrennial (CZ), World Stage Design (CAN), People of Theatre (UK), Brisbane Art Design, University of Melbourne, Australian Production Design Guild and Ahead of the Game Artist Residency. Dissatisfied with master narratives and the systems and spaces that uphold them, M'ck seeks out collaborative scenographic practices that embrace difference and disrupt privilege in process, form and content.

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


